Quality of Life Calls

There is a big reduction of overall incidents compared to last month.

This is a result of a higher volume of high visibility patrols over the period, coupled with the very inclement weather.

There have been no fire calls this period.

7 Persons have been reported to the Procurator Fiscal in relation to the Drugs Offences.

The Public Nuisance calls on Holburn Street are attributed to late night revellers leaving the city centre.

One premise, the homeless hostel on Crown Street, is responsible for the 3 Drug related offences.

There is a slight increase 8 of incidents in these categories compared to last month.

The main increases compared to last month are possession of Drugs and Theft by Housebreaking.

Streets with more than one crime are as follows:

Gladstone Place	Vandalism	2
Crown Street	Possession of drugs	3

The vandalisms on Gladstone Place were part of a spray paint series around the same area. Enquiries continue to trace the person responsible and residents are requested to keep an eye out for persons acting suspiciously.

The homeless hostel on Crown Street is the main cause of the Drug related calls this period. Each offence has been reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

Summary of Calls and Crimefiles compared to last month:

AS3A – Ferryhill

- Quality of life calls have reduced by 12
- There no Housebreaking calls
- Vandalisms have increased by 3
- Thefts of or from vehicles increased by 1
- Overall CrimeFile offences have reduced by 9

AS3B – Mannofield

- Quality of life calls have reduced by 1
- There were 2 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have increased by 1
- Thefts of or from vehicles have increased by 3
- Overall CrimeFile offences have increased by 8

AS3C – West End

- Quality of life calls have reduced by 2
- There were 2 Housebreakings
- Vandalisms have reduced by 3
- Thefts of or from vehicles have reduced by 2
- Overall CrimeFile offences have reduced by 5
